COVID-19 - Guidance Notes - Using the Pub

1 – Arriving. Using the Bar. Ordering and Paying

- There is a ONE WAY system in operation
- Enter via the CAR PARK door and EXIT via the front door
- Each group/bubble can contain up to 6 people, please find a table (if ordering food please remember your table number) and designate a member to order
- Only ONE person is allowed at the bar at a time
- Please queue from the CAR PARK entrance (under the marquee if raining) keeping 2m from the person in front.
- Please use the HAND SANITISER station provided in the car park entrance porch window before entering the bar area
- Come to the bar and place/pay for your order. Food will be delivered to your table
- You will be asked to leave your name, address and contact number with the bar staff. This is for NHS Test and Trace purposes
- When possible please pay for your order using a card (contactless is allowed up to £45.00)

2 – Using the Toilets

- Please follow the ONE WAY system described above
- Only TWO people are allowed in the ladies or gents at a time
- Please queue in the corridor
- Only ONE male and ONE female are allowed to queue in the corridor. If there are more than this, please come back later
- Before leaving the toilets please SANITISE using the facilities provided

- If the toilet paper, paper towels, antibacterial soap or hand sanitiser are used up/missing please report this to a member of staff immediately

3 – Smoking

- Please leave/enter the pub using the ONE WAY system
- Only FOUR people are allowed in the smoking shelter at a time
- Please queue in front of the shelter and do not block the path leading up to the shelter
- Observe SOCIAL DISTANCING measures while using and queueing for the smoking shelter

4 – Children

- Please ensure that children in your group observe social distancing measures and remain within your group
- Children from one group should not mix with children from another group

5 – Pets

- We are a dog friendly pub and enjoy visits from our four legged friends, however, during COVID-19 please keep your dog on a lead and with you at your table at all times
